In order that Woodland Learning sessions may be run safely, Woodventurers will:

- Ensure that all Woodland Learning staff and volunteers are aware of their responsibilities towards the children attending Woodland Learning sessions and adults/volunteers working alongside.
- Provide Woodland learning staff and volunteers with appropriate induction training to ensure they are familiar with current health and safety policies and procedures. (See Appendix 1)
- Ensure all Health and Safety policies are regularly reviewed and amended as required.
- Ensure staff and volunteers are informed of any updates/revisions to these policies and procedures.

The Woodland Learning staff and volunteers will:

- Ensure the health and safety of those attending Woodland Learning sessions to the best of their ability.
- Hold a current enhanced DBS certificate and have attended safeguarding training.
- Have an up to date First Aid qualification with an outdoor element.
- Adhere to Woodventurers' Health and Safety policies and procedures outlined in Appendix 1.
- Put the health and safety of those in their care first and should a planned activity be compromised by health and safety concerns, modify the activity appropriately.
